ENGINEER-MANAGER'S REPORT: Gutowski reported Midland County Road Commission will be here Tuesday, March 27, at 10:00 a.m. for construction training on GRS abutments along with OHM. Township Park Road Ultra-thin Asphalt Overlay and Emmet Heights Road reconstruction bids are due April 3, 2018. On April 4, 2018 in Traverse City, there is a utility coordination meeting. An Ultra-thin project will be completed on M-119 from Beach Drive to US 31 by Payne & Dolan, starting in mid April with estimated completion June 1, 2018.

SUPERVISOR'S REPORT: Beckman reported working on Certification Maps which are due March 31 and IRT Asset Management reporting for Act 51. Middle Road Bridge meetings have occurred. Plans and specifications for this year are in process.

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PERMIT/CAD REPORT: Godzik reported work has started on Gully Road. North Conway Road is marked out and cutting will start soon.

EQUIPMENT SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT: Genson reported they are beginning to pull down trucks from winter to prepare them for summer projects as Middle Road Bridge is starting April 15. Two trucks and two new loaders should be here by the first part of May. Two of three slip-in sanders have been delivered. Two used loaders will be advertised for sale by bid next week.

COMMISSIONERS' REPORT: Commissioner Zulski mentioned the cost per mile for construction will be going up as there are not enough contractors and employees available for hire. Zulski mentioned the CRA Annual Highway Conference in Lansing was very productive and one of the topics was the difficulty in finding qualified workers as the private sector attracts and pays more than road commissions. Others agencies are recruiting truck drivers from high schools with the offer to help them get training and their CDL. Emmet County Commissioner Drier went to Pellston High School for career day where many students indicated they would like to hear from the Road Commission for future careers in truck driving. Zulski offered to go with Gutowski to the high schools to recruit future employees. Gutowski is working with Roscommon County Road Commission and they will be sending their recruitment and training program information to us. Emmet County Commissioner Scheel mentioned the local college is now offering trainings on this topic also.

ROAD FOREMAN'S REPORT: None.

FINANCE DIRECTOR REPORT: Kleeman reported the Governor has signed the bill for an additional \$175 Million to be disbursed from the general fund and we will receive our portion of \$407,918.07 next week.

## PUBLIC COMMENT:

a. Jonathon Scheel inquired about the trees at the corner of Mitchell and Boyer and Godzik reported the Cottonwoods were taken down.
